About Beth Shadur

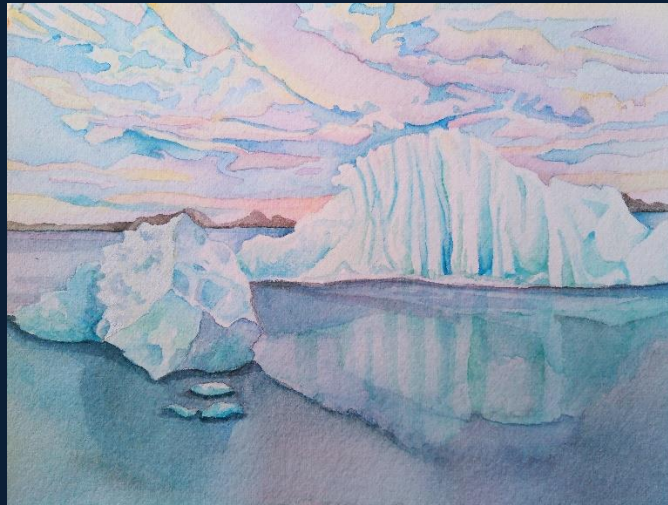


Beth Shadur is an artist who has exhibited widely in solo and group exhibitions in the United States and abroad, including at the Art Institute of Chicago; the Drawing Center in New York City; the Hudson River Museum in Yonkers, NY; the Butler Institute of Art in Youngstown, Ohio; and at the Colorado Springs Art Museum, Colorado Springs, CO. She has created over 150 large public murals as public, private and community art projects in both the United States and Great Britain.

As an educator, Shadur has lectured widely on community arts and taught in both the United States and abroad at the university level. She has curated numerous national exhibitions, including the ongoing 'The Poetic Dialogue Project', which has traveled throughout the United States. She currently serves as Gallery Director at Prairie State College, curating five exhibitions a year. Shadur has been awarded numerous Ragdale Fellowships and is a Thomas Watson Fellow from Brown University. In 2008, Shadur was Artist-in-Residence at the Burren College of Art in Ireland through a Governor's Award for International Arts Exchange from the Illinois Arts Council. In 2013, Shadur was a fellow at the Leighton Artist Colony at the Banff Centre for the Arts in Banff, Alberta, Canada. In 2016, she was awarded a residency at the Harfnarborg Art Center in Harfnarjardur, Iceland. In 2016, she was appointed to the Board of Trustees of the Illinois State Museum. Her work is owned in many private and public collections.

Beth Shadur: Artist

Shadur's art work has been included in such important exhibitions as Art and Cartography, and the Chicago and Vicinity Exhibition at the Art Institute of Chicago; the Drawing Center, NY's Selections 13 and New Drawing in America, NYC; New Horizons and Convergence: The Poetic Dialogue Project at the Chicago Cultural Center; and has had over 50 solo exhibitions in museums, galleries and universities.



Beth Shadur: Artist Statement

The National Park Project

My newest body of work, **The National Park Project**, has resulted as a continuation of my works in the *Fragility of the Sacred* series, comprising paintings and individual handmade artists' books integrating idea, text and visual images, with the theme of fragility. I am undertaking this work now as I am a mid-career artist, facing the recent loss of my mother, and the loss of my father and sister to rare forms of cancer. This theme has been present in my life in many aspects and deserves interpretation and exploration. I am looking at fragility of not only the wider environment, but the fragility of our own lives, both in terms of physical fragility but in terms of emotional fragility so common in our current world situation. As I age, I understand more significantly how fragile our plans are for our futures, and I often use symbolism to explore and portray these ideas.

My most recent series aspires to explore the National Parks as pristine environments that need to be considered as sacred to protect the land and environment which serves as our nation's natural legacy. They explore the legacy of Native peoples whose land was taken for the National Parks, and the impact of the creation of the parks on various tribal uses. The exhibition and research were funded, in part, from an Artist Grant through the Illinois Arts Council Agency; the support allowed me to visit and photograph the five national parks that are in Utah and do continuous research for my artwork. Most importantly, I am reflecting on the impact of climate change, tourism, and man's use of natural resources on each park; the paintings will reflect these concerns by representing the natural beauty, plants and animals impacted and threatened, and using text to address the fragility of the natural environment there.

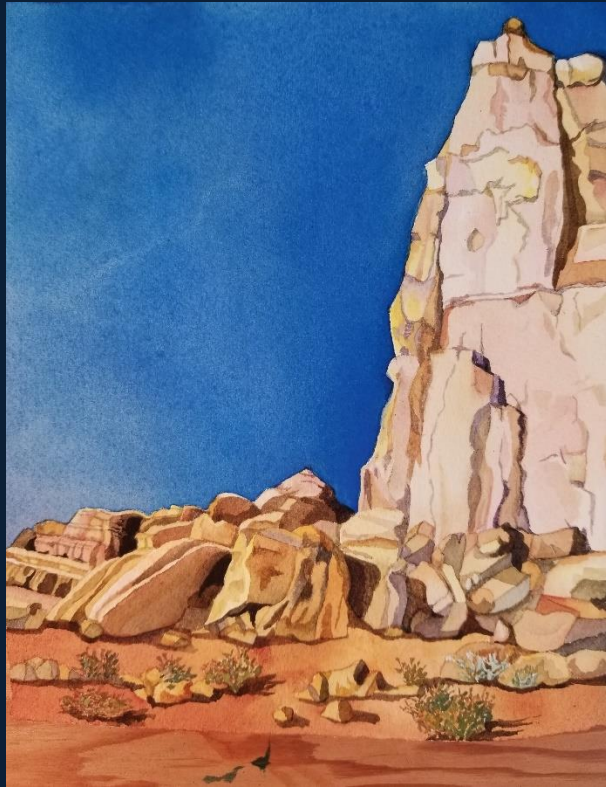
This work is a continuation of the work I have undertaken as an Artist in Residence in various exceptional natural environments. I took three weeks as an Artist in Residence at the Leighton Artist Colony, Banff Centre for the Arts. During my time there, the series on "fragility" transformed to *Fragility of the Sacred*, as I embraced the sacred ground on which I worked. I began to think of what we hold sacred, and how we often devalue that, and how to resolve that issue in my own life. The sacred quality of the landscape and earth is embraced by First Nation people who live in the Banff National Park area; I found their idea of Vision Quest within the land appealing as I worked there, and found passionate inspiration in my research and direct work in the land. That residency informed my ideas of the sacred, and will continue in the years to come.

Two years ago, I undertook a residency at the Harfnarborg Art Museum in Hafnarjördur, Iceland. My previous ideas about the impact of our human footprint on the environment were emphasized by the sensational ecosystems of Iceland, which has a wide-ranging geology of fire and ice, magnificent in its breathtaking beauty, but which is highly threatened by global warming. Glacial melt threatens to destroy all glaciers there within 100 years. Volcanic eruptions are increasing and threaten not only the natural but built environment. Our stewardship of the earth proves increasingly important. For many years, my work has addressed the fragility of nature, and reflected my vast love for nature. I want my current work on the National Parks to address this alarming circumstance by expressing the wondrous beauty of the natural environment, while reminding us of its fragility. It is only with strong attention to our human impact that we can reverse what are dangerous trends; we must take action now before it is too late.

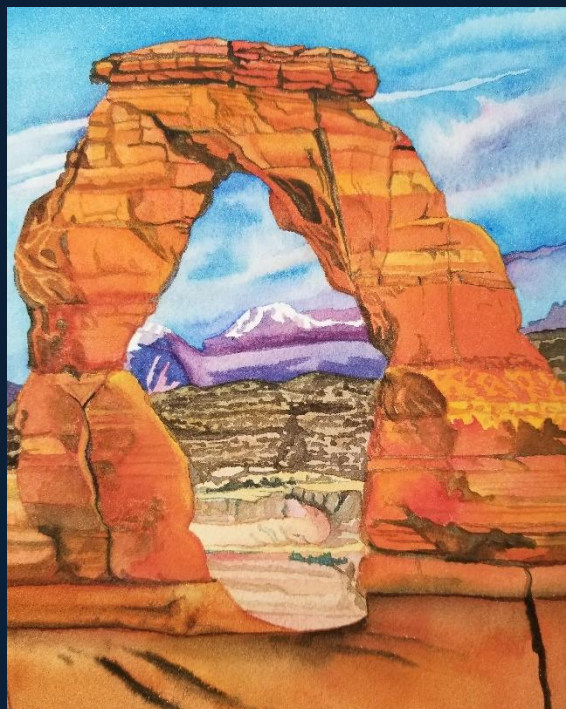


Cleave (Glacier NP)

A Different World (Arches NP), wc with mixed media

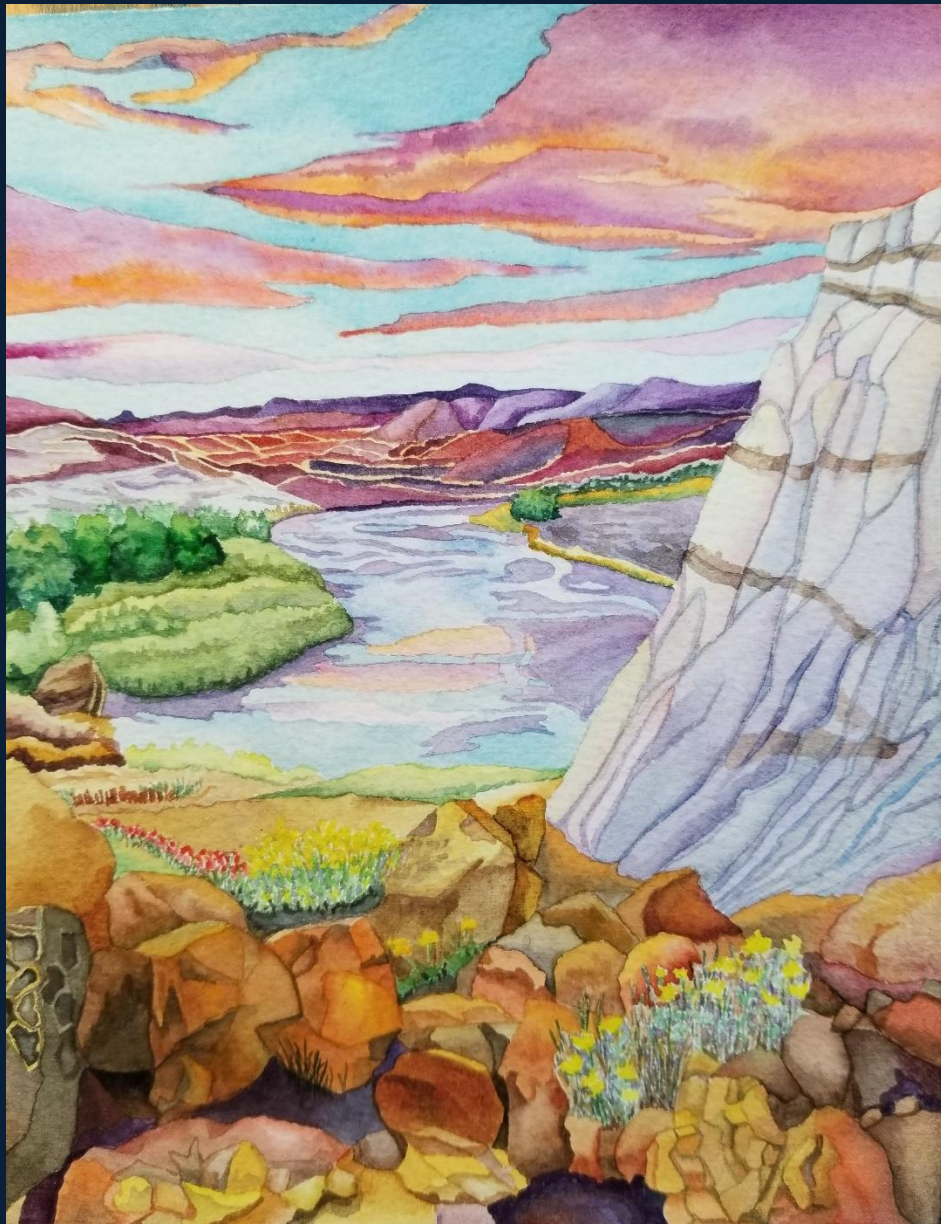


Arches Tor (Arches NP) wc

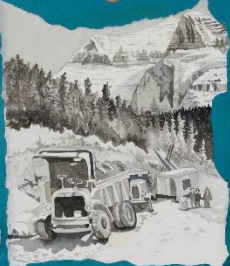


This collage is a visual representation of Theodore Roosevelt National Park. It features a variety of elements:

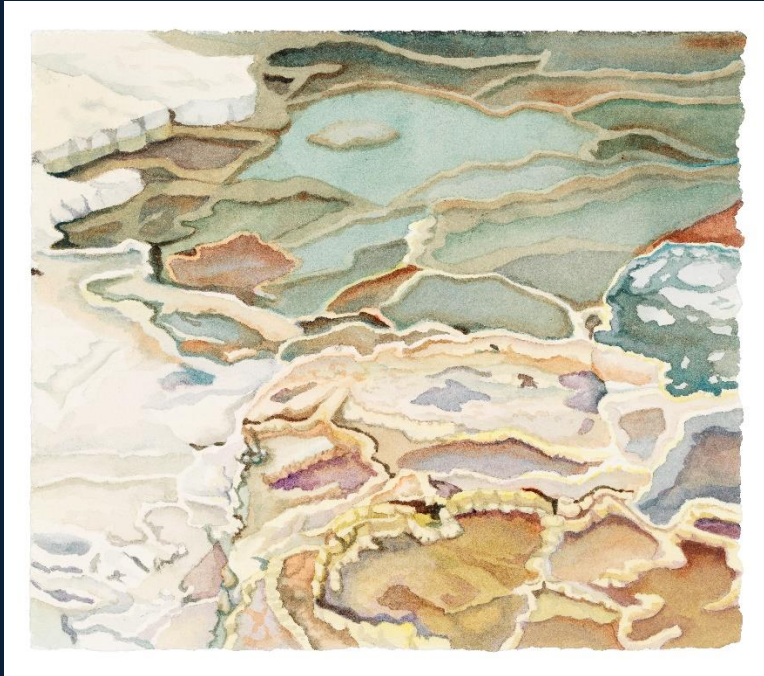

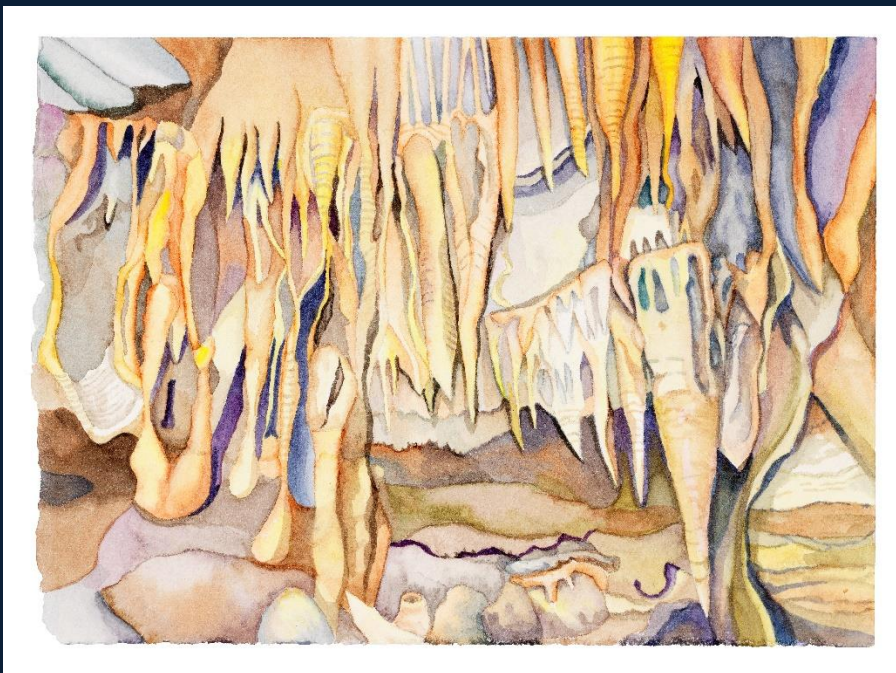

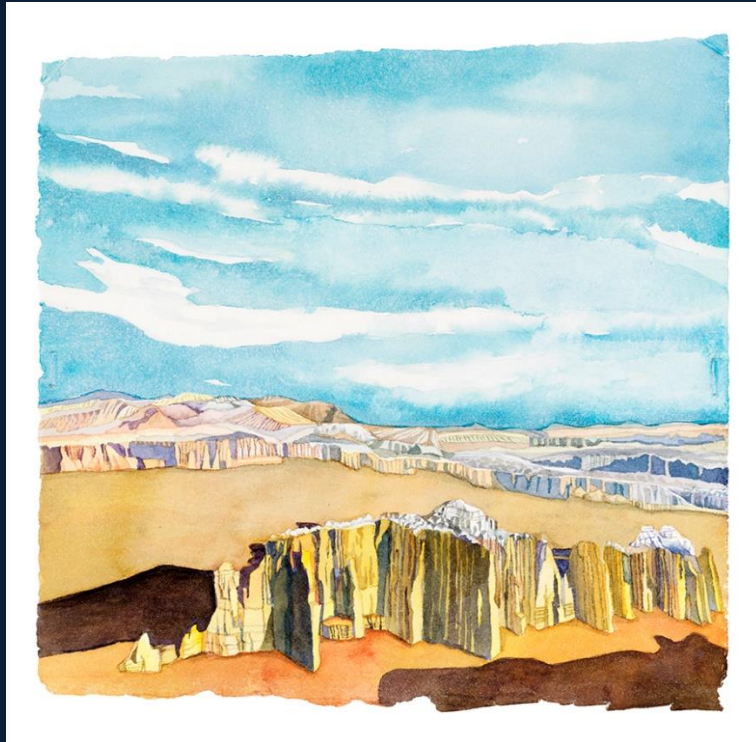

Beth Shadur: Curator

As Gallery Director at Prairie State College since 2012, Beth Shadur curates five exhibitions yearly. She has curated a wide variety of exhibitions, from Narrative!, an exhibition featuring Eleanor Spiess-Ferris, John Pitman Weber and Gladys Nilsson, to The Discerning Eye, a photography exhibition featuring master photographers Dawoud Bey, Terry Evans and the late Joseph Jachna. Exhibitions have included artists from the Midwest and elsewhere, and shows embrace all media.

Shadur has been an independent curator of exhibitions since 1994. Besides her renowned The Poetic Dialogue Project, begun in 2004, resulting in four exhibitions, (most recent in 2016 at Ukrainian Institute of Art, Chicago) including at the Chicago Cultural Center, Shadur has been the Curator for several other national and international exhibitions. In 2017, Shadur curated “Figurative Allusion” at the Art Center of Highland Park, IL. In 2005, she co-curated, with Scottish artist Miriam Vickers, an international exchange exhibition between the artists of ARC Gallery, Chicago, and those of Patriothall Gallery, Edinburgh, Scotland, which was featured in the Edinburgh Festival. Among other exhibitions Shadur has curated is “Environmental Concerns, Artemisia Gallery, Chicago; “East Meets West” and “West Meets East”, two exhibitions featuring women artists from both coasts of Florida.

In 1997, Shadur co-curated “Deep Water,” an exhibition of works in water-based media at the Sarasota Center for Visual Arts, including contemporary works in watercolor that challenged the usual definition of watercolor as a medium to paint only beauty. The exhibition included various masters of watercolor, including Sondra Freckelton, Patricia Tobacco Forrester and others, and was published in an article in Watercolor Magazine in 1997.

Beth Shadur: Mural Artist

Shadur has created over 170 murals since 1983 in such settings as private homes, public buildings, libraries, medical offices and hospitals, universities, day care facilities, post offices and shopping malls. In 2014, Shadur won a mural competition to create a large mural for the Warren Newport Public Library in Gurnee, IL, on the theme of “life-long learning.” Shadur also creates collaborative murals with participants in such settings as schools, art centers, and community centers.

Murals transform and enhance the interior or exterior environment. Artist Beth Shadur designs and hand paints a site-specific mural to meet the needs of the client and space. Her murals show sensitivity to the architectural environment, setting, color scheme and style of each site. Whether to beautify offices or homes, stores or public buildings, or to create a special mood or atmosphere, a custom designed mural transforms an area into an exciting experience. Whether the need is for a trompe l’oeil architectural mural, a fantasy mural, wall graphics or more realistic images, Shadur can work in a wide range of styles that are appropriate to each commission for her clients. The project might include built-in furniture created specifically for the environment. She also can transform an already cherished piece of furniture with hand painting; she has undertaken many such projects for residential and contract clients. She works closely with architects and interior designers in many instances as part of a design team to meet the needs of her clients.
